








### SELMA TOOLKIT CONCEPT MODEL

A comprehensive set of themes and subthemes emerged from the thematic analysis, covering a rich variety of adolescent ideas and perspectives in relation to online hate speech, as synthesised below in the form of six master themes:

- 1. Freedom of speech
- 2. Offline and online hate speech
- 3. Hate speech versus bullying
- 4. Victims, perpetrators and bystanders
- 5. Perceptions on ways to address online hate speech
- 6. The social impact of hate speech

"Verbal violence... Sister. Animal, ....Fascists...Fat. Ugly... Gipsy, Origin...Disabled."

"Like if something bad happens and someone writes a post about it on Facebook, and everyone shares it and then it's all over Facebook."

(Group 3, Germany)


